A LETTER FROM OUR ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



Welcome to Theatre Horizon! I'm thrilled that we can finally present the regional premiere of Gracie Gardner's ATHENA, a production originally planned for our 2019/20 season, now two-years in the making.

One of my favorite elements of this script is that the only note playwright Gracie Gardner gives to people who are about to stage it is "Resist the urge to get cute, these women are blunt." I love watching Mary Wallace and Athena, the two characters you will encounter in this production, because of their bluntness. In a world where women are socialized to put politeness, appeasement, and caretaking of others above all else, it is thrilling to watch these two young women unapologetically defy those expectations. I love living in the world of this show because it reminds

me that another world is possible.

This play gives me hope that a new generation of young women, and the space they've found for themselves in various arenas, may remain with them as they grow older. That they might give themselves permission to cry, scream, feel anger, celebrate, weep, and most of all, hold one another in solidarity, even beyond stadium lighting and darkened theaters.

Thank you for being here and hope to see you at TOWN, our most ambitious project to date, premiering in September.



A LETTER FROM OUR DIRECTOR



In their first training session together, teenage fencers Mary Wallace and Athena debate the purpose of sports. I won't say too much about this moment—there's a joke in there I don't want to give away—but their perspectives, at least in this early moment in the play, are quite different. Athena finds competition to be a helpful benchmark for comparing herself to others; Mary Wallace values camaraderie and the mind-body connection.

I have a third perspective. As a theater artist whose only childhood sporting trophy was in bowling (it gets worse—I think it was only a participation trophy?), I'm most keenly interested in sports for their metaphorical power. And this is a play rich in sports metaphors. In both

fencing and conversation, these two young women attack and parry and riposte. They try to justify a few dirty tricks; they hurt each other. But they also get stronger by learning how to fight.

At the end of our first day of fencing training, our brilliant fight director, Alex Cordaro, asked the cast what they'd learned. I wrote down their responses because, again, they were such beautiful metaphors for the play as a whole.

KIRA: This is a brave sport. I mean, I knew that, but it feels really different once a blade is coming at you.

CAMPBELL: The more you commit to the attack, the more you open yourself up and become vulnerable.

KIRA: Yeah! If I don't stick her, she'll stick me. And once you're worn out, you don't hold yourself back. You just don't have the capacity.

Athena explores the limits of teamwork in a culture that worships individual achievement—whether that's fencing or our society at large. The play also reveals the ways in which we are conditioned to pursue our lives as a zero-sum game, measuring our improvements in comparison to others. But at its core, Athena employs fencing as a profound metaphor for growing up, especially growing up in a woman's body: it's brave, vulnerable, exhausting, sometimes messy, and it requires some strategy, even brutality, in order to stay safe. How painful and wonderful.

ATHENA was rehearsed and performed at Theatre Horizon in Norristown, which stands on the territory known as "Lenapehoking," the ancestral home of the Lenape people.

For the past 10,000 years, the Lenape have been the original caretakers and stewards of Lenapehoking—one of numerous tribes that comprised tens of millions of people residing on this continent prior to the invasion of European colonizers.

We recognize that Isaac Norris, Sr.—Norristown's namesake—purchased land from the family of William Penn even though nobody "owns" Lenapehoking. We acknowledge that Isaac Norris, Sr. was a slaveholder who benefited from a system that captured, sold, and enslaved over 10 million Africans who were trafficked to various locations in North America, South America, and the Caribbean.

We acknowledge the 6 million African Americans that moved from the American South to the Northeast during The Great Migration and their role in making places like Norristown a central hub for industry and retail. Finally, with a large Latinx population in Norristown—particularly people from Puerto Rico and Mexico—we acknowledge the past, present, and future legacies of the Taíno and Aztec peoples.
